After what feels like over a year of collecting information, meeting with solar contractors and coordinating with financial institutions the time has come for the membership to come together and discuss the advisability of looking to the sun for our future electrical needs. Board Members Ed Benes and Dick Buchner with Solar Contractor/Member Rich Maher will present an educating program, explain options and respond to questions regarding the advisability of entering into an agreement to purchase/lease a comprehensive solar panel system. This meeting will be held on **Tuesday, August 14, 2018** @ **6:00** PM in the Dinning/Assembly Room of our Club House. As this investment could involve a significant financial expenditure all proprietary members will, in the near future, be provided with a ballot to be returned and counted. The cost of the proposal, the placement of the panels and the lease terms which will, in ten (10) years result in the system being fully paid for will be discussed. Those who know little of solar panel systems are encouraged to attend and learn, those who know everything there is to know about solar systems are encouraged to attend and educate others.

Our course management company, BrightView recently leveled and re-sodded tees on the Fourth (4th) and Sixth (6th) holes. Over many years of pouring sand into divots on those par three holes a "crowning" developed. While the new tees have been laser leveled, given time, members could create an uneven surface again. BrightView has accepted responsibility, as part of their daily maintenance, to repair any divots left on the par three tee boxes in a way that does not result in uneven surfaces. Members have been requested to stop pouring sand into and over divots on the par three holes. Sand boxes (with the little shovels) will be removed and we will observe how this new system works. Should issues develop this will be revisited.

Last month Merced Golf and Country Club sponsored the 67th Annual Merced County Amateur Golf Tournament. This event attracts some of the finest golfers thoughout the state. College and other scratch golfers descend on our Club with expectations of walking away with the title of "Champion". Some look at our course and announce that they will breeze through without breaking a sweat. They look at the first hole, take out an iron and expect to drive onto the green. This year the competition was at its best. At the end, however, only one person brought our course to its knees. Local member and successful attorney, Rick Marchini rose to the top and was the only player to shoot even par in the tournament (that's gross even par). Congratulations to MG&CC's own Rick Marchini for his excellent play.

Our Meet, Greet and Eat dinner was a rousing success. It was wonderful to see our pool area full of children and adults alike. Food was fantastic as usual and the ability to meet other members and their families was rewarding.







CLUBHOUSE & DINING ROOM

All members and guests are required to adhere to Merced Country Club's Dress Code when in the club. These general guidelines apply for adults and children above the age of five. The dress code is listed below:

Jackets maybe required for more formal events. Women are requested to dress in a fashion compatible with the dress required of men, which may include dresses, skirts, slacks or pantsuits.

Typical golf attire; and clean, comfortable attire are encouraged at all times. Ladies may wear sleeveless shirts that have a collar; or a non collared shirt with sleeves. Men's Golf attire, blue denim clothing and blue denim jeans in good, clean condition are acceptable attire in the Bar, Dining Room, Patio, Pool, Parking Lot, Pro Shop, Locker Rooms and Club Offices.

NO BLUE DENIM JEANS are allowed on the Golf Course, Putting Green, Driving Range, and Practice Facility.

The following attire is <u>NOT allowed</u> in the *Clubhouse* (Including the Dining Room, Bar and Banquet Room), on the *Golf Course or Driving Range*

- Shorts, skorts or skirts higher than 4" above the knee
- T-Shirts or Tank Tops; Gym Shorts or any other Gym attire.
- Overalls; cut-offs; clothes with frayed edges or holes
- Swimsuits or Swimwear of any kind; wet or soiled clothing
- Trousers, or other types of clothing that clearly are extreme in size and that cause the clothing item to hang loosely from the body, or that may expose areas of the body or visible undergarments, are prohibited.
- Tops exposing the mid-sections or other areas of the body are not acceptable.

Exceptions to the dress code will be: Attire worn for <u>Theme</u> <u>Parties</u> and other designated events which the general Manager must approve prior to the events.

Wearing appropriate blue denim will be permitted on the golf course although not encouraged, from November 1 through March 31.

Other Restrictions to: Bar, Dining Room, and Banquet Rooms

- Hats/caps for gentlemen are not permitted in the dining room except as traditional religious, ethnic, or medical head covering. Hats/caps must be worn facing forward. It is appropriate etiquette for gentlemen to remove hats while indoors.
- Shoes and/or sandals must be worn at all times.
- Soft spikes are not permitted in the Dining Room.
