One year ago, after weeks of heavy rain, strong winds from the south toppled almost thirty mature trees across our course. BrightView, our course maintenance company, jumped in and its crew, chain saws in hand, did what could be done to put the course back into semi-playable condition. Members responded with their own efforts and everyone showed complete understanding as the months passed and progress slowly was made. The Board, under President Jerry Corman, worked diligently with our insurance company, the installers of our driving range protective netting, BrightView and with Anderson Tree Service to restore our course.

This month the driving range nets are up and better than ever, uprooted cement cart paths have been repaired and the last of the replacement trees have now been put into the ground. During this time our membership displayed a cooperative effort that should make us all proud to be associated with one another.

However, our Club is more than simply a place to hit a small round ball. All ladies find that they can be surrounded with friends and special events whether they want to play 18 holes or just 9. Senior men find companionship, tournaments and opportunities to play many other private clubs at a remarkably low cost as members of our "Seniors" organization. Our Club sponsors the "First Tee", an organization, open to children of members and non-members alike that teaches lessons in sportsmanship, general behavior and (last in importance) golf skills. We truly have a Club that benefits its members and the community in general. Under the guidance of our Pro and Board Member Arron Castleton, we are moving aggressively to become the home course for the University of California – Merced Golf team. With our membership continuing to grow, and with the

January marked the end of the 2017 season with a local event and our great Senior Association awards dinner. Everyone raved about the filet mignon and salmon dinners. Sign-ups for this season have been very positive, we already have more people signed up for this year than we did in 2017.

The Merced Senior Golf Association was founded in 1969. Over the ensuing 49 years our intrepid group of golfers, 50 and over, have traveled far and wide around the San Joaquin Valley.

Our members pay an annual membership fee of \$40 which entitles them to a free annual dinner in January to celebrate our past season of golf and comradery. That annual fee also gives our members the opportunity to participate in four local golf events here at the club, and starting in April, seven away events at other clubs in the Southern Valley Senior Association (SVS) and 10 events at other clubs in the San Joaquin Valley Travel League (SJVTL). We also host events at our club with each of the other 18 clubs in these two leagues. The other four events our members play include an exchange with our MGCC women's golf groups, the annual Senior Invitational and a twoday Senior Championship. Winners of the Championship travel the next year to play in the San Joaquin Travel League Pro-Am. That adds up to almost 30 events from January thru November.

MERCED GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB DRESS CODE

CLUBHOUSE & DINING ROOM

All members and guests are required to adhere to Merced Country Club's Dress Code when in the club. These general guidelines apply for adults and children above the age of five. The dress code is listed below:

Jackets maybe required for more formal events. Women are requested to dress in a fashion compatible with the dress required of men, which may include dresses, skirts, slacks or pantsuits.

Typical golf attire; and clean, comfortable attire are encouraged at all times. Ladies may wear sleeveless shirts that have a collar; or a non collared shirt with sleeves. Men's Golf attire, blue denim clothing and blue denim jeans in good, clean condition are acceptable attire in the Bar, Dining Room, Patio, Pool, Parking Lot, Pro Shop, Locker Rooms and Club Offices .

NO BLUE DENIM JEANS are allowed on the Golf Course, Putting Green, Driving Range, and Practice Facility.

The following attire is NOT allowed in the Clubhouse (Including the Dining Room, Bar and Banquet Room), on the Golf Course or Driving Range

- Shorts, skorts or skirts higher than 4" above the knee
- T-Shirts or Tank Tops; Gym Shorts or any other Gym attire.
- Overalls; cut-offs; clothes with frayed edges or holes
- Swimsuits or Swimwear of any kind; wet or soiled clothing
- Trousers, or other types of clothing that clearly are extreme in size and that cause the clothing item to hang loosely from the body, or that may expose areas of the body or visible undergarments, are prohibited.
- Tops exposing the mid-sections or other areas of the body are not acceptable.

Exceptions to the dress code will be: Attire worn for Theme Parties and other designated events which the general Manager must approve prior to the events.

Wearing appropriate blue denim will be permitted on the golf course although not encouraged, from November 1 through March 31.

Other Restrictions to: Bar, Dining Room, and Banquet Rooms

- Hats/caps for gentlemen are not permitted in the dining room except as traditional religious, ethnic, or medical head covering. Hats/caps must be worn facing forward. It is appropriate etiquette for gentlemen to remove hats while indoors.
- Shoes and/or sandals must be worn at all times.
- Soft spikes are not permitted in the Dining Room.
