
CLUB STAFF

PRO'S Corner Andy Aubertin PGA Club PRO

Hello All!

With the driving range being closed frequently this last month due to wet turf conditions, and possibly being closed intermittently going forward until we get to Spring, now is a good time to sharpen up on one of the most important aspects of the game... PUTTING!

Do all my putting attempts require a thorough thought process? YES! During practice is the time to reinforce good habits and think through your putting process. On the course is another story, and I believe the fewer thoughts going through your head the better while on the course. We should try to be consistent and do the same thing every time you hit a putt or take a swing.

Simply stated, there are a few key things we all should do to produce a successful putting stroke:

- a) Roll the ball on the correct path or line.
- b) Produce the right speed to match the line we have chosen.

Sounds easy enough, but prior to that, here are some suggestions to help you.

- 1. Position the ball approximately one ball width forward of center.
- 2. Eye line directly over the ball.
- 3. Set the club face square to the target.
- 4. Relax and be comfortable.
- 5. Use an accelerating stroke.
- 6. Keep the body motion limited
- 7. Make solid contact by hitting the ball in the putter's "sweet spot".

LOOKING AHEAD

All members and guests are required to adhere to Merced Country Club's Dress Code when in the club. These general guidelines apply for adults and children above the age of five.

CLUBHOUSE & DINING ROOM DRESS CODE

The dress code is listed below:

Jackets maybe required for more formal events. Women are requested to dress in a fashion compatible with the dress required of men, which may include dresses, skirts, slacks or pantsuits.

Typical golf attire; and clean, comfortable attire are encouraged at all times. Ladies may wear sleeveless shirts that have a collar; or a non collared shirt with sleeves. Men's Golf attire, blue denim clothing and blue denim jeans in good, clean condition are acceptable attire in the Bar, Dining Room, Patio, Pool, Parking Lot, Pro Shop, Locker Rooms and Club Offices.

NO BLUE DENIM JEANS are allowed on the Golf Course, Putting Green, Driving Range, and Practice Facility.

The following attire is <u>NOT allowed</u> in the *Clubhouse* (Including the Dining Room, Bar and Banquet Room), on the *Golf Course* or *Driving Range*

- Shorts, skorts or skirts higher than mid-thigh.
- T-Shirts or Tank Tops; Gym Shorts or any other Gym attire.
- Overalls; cut-offs; clothes with frayed edges or holes
- Swimsuits or Swimwear of any kind; wet or soiled clothing
- Trousers, or other types of clothing that clearly are extreme in size and that cause the clothing item to hang loosely from the body, or that may expose areas of the body or visible undergarments, are prohibited.
- Tops exposing the mid-sections or other areas of the body are not acceptable.

Exceptions to the dress code will be: Attire worn for <u>Theme</u> <u>Parties</u> and other designated events which the general Manager must approve prior to the events.

Wearing appropriate blue denim will be permitted on the golf course although not encouraged, from November 1 through March 31.

Other Restrictions to: Bar, Dining Room, and Banquet Rooms

- Hats/caps for gentlemen are not permitted in the dining room except as traditional religious, ethnic, or medical head covering. Hats/caps must be worn facing forward. It is appropriate etiquette for gentlemen to remove hats while indoors.
- Shoes and/or sandals must be worn at all times.
- Soft spikes are not permitted in the Dining Room.
